

Option 1 / British School, 4 year plan

This option will ensure few changes to the current curriculum. Most of the subjects will be taught in English. However, from September 2020 we will be providing an additional Czech language lesson per week. So instead of three, there will be four regular and compulsory Czech lessons for children who are Czech nationals.

We will preserve our British accreditation in full compliance with the standards for British Schools Overseas, which is checked regularly by a foreign inspectorate. The curriculum will continue to be modelled on the Cambridge & International Primary curriculum frameworks, as well as the very best that comes from the British international education tradition.

In addition, since all of the new revenue will be used to fund salary increases, as planned by the Czech government, the school will gradually be able to offer salaries which will be competitive on an international scale. Thus, our target will be to employ, in the coming four years, more teachers who are native speakers, well qualified and experienced, to work in an international school where English is the main language of instruction.

This plan takes into account a steady increase of payroll expenses from the academic year 19/20 included and over the next four years starting from September 2020. If we are successful in achieving these financial goals, the school will remain established as a British international school. There is a 13.5% increase in fees in the first year. Then it is 12.5%, 10.5% and 10% in the following three years.
